As part of East-Central Iowa REC's commitment to our community, we are pleased to offer scholarships to area students who want to further their education.

Every year, ECI REC will award up to 10 students \$1,000 to continue their education in college in any field. ECI REC also offers up to two \$1,000 scholarships to those who have been accepted to attend the two-year Powerline Technology program at Northwest Iowa Community College.

TO BE ELIGIBLE, STUDENTS MUST DO THE FOLLOWING:

- Have parents or legal guardians who are members of ECI REC.
- Graduate from high school during the spring the application is due (Powerline applicants may be out of high school as long as they or their parents or legal guardians are members of ECI REC).
- Plan to continue their education at a two- or four- year institution.

HOW TO APPLY: Starting each November, the application form will be available at ecirec.coop, from high school guidance counselors, or by emailing scholarships@ecirec.coop.

DEADLINE: Applications are taken starting each November and are typically due at the end of February or beginning of March of the following year.

POWERLINE PROGRAM

Every year, ECI REC offers up to two \$1,000 scholarships for those accepted to attend the Powerline Technology program at Northwest Iowa Community College. Powerline installers have excellent employment opportunities across the country, and those with formal training typically have higher starting salaries and greater advancement prospects.

THE PROGRAM

- Placement rates are almost 100%, with over 30% of students getting jobs before graduation.
- The average starting salary has been around \$22/hour.
- Class time is split about equally between classroom lecture and hands-on time outdoors on poles.
- Possible careers: line foreman, line superintendent, operations manager, office manager, sales associate, technician, or member service advisor.

REQUIREMENTS

- One year of high school algebra.
- Various physical requirements, such as the ability to lift at least 80 pounds, work in both extremely hot and cold weather, etc.
- Working in a team environment.
- Ascending and descending from various heights.
- Drug screening.

CAREERS IN COOPERATIVES

Graduates of a program like Powerline earn an Associate in Applied Science degree, which puts them in high demand by rural electric cooperatives like ECI REC.

At ECI REC, you'll join a dynamic work environment and an organization with strong values.
