

April Is Safe Digging Month!

Be safe. Always call 811 before you dig to locate any buried utility lines.



Know what's **below. Call** before you dig.

LARGE TREES

Height/spread of more than 40 feet. such as:

- Maple
 Birch
- Oak
- Sweetgum
- Pine
- Spruce Linden

Height/spread of 25 to 40 feet, such as:

MEDIUM TREES


- Washington hawthorn
- Goldenraintree
- Eastern redbud
- American arborvitae
- Dogwood

SMALL TREES

Avoid planting within 20 feet of power lines. When planting within 20 feet is unavoidable, use only shrubs and small trees

Height/spread of no more than 25 feet. such as:

- Star magnolia
- Crabapple
- Lilac
