**EACH JUNE, ECI REC SPONSORS TWO HIGH SCHOOL JUNIORS ON THIS ALL-EXPENSES-PAID TRIP TO WASHINGTON, D.C.**

For over 50 years, electric cooperatives have sponsored high school students from across America on a visit to the nation's capital during the Electric Cooperative Youth Tour.

A joint effort of local electric co-ops such as ECI REC, the Iowa Association of Electric Cooperatives (IAEC), and the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA), the Youth Tour sends around 30 Iowa students on this experience annually. Iowa students join around 1,500 others from around the country for a week of visiting historical sites, meeting congressional leaders, and learning about American history and government.

## INCREDIBLE OPPORTUNITIES

The Youth Tour introduces students to influential policymakers and takes them to visit key landmarks in and around Washington, D.C. Previous Youth Tour participants have met Sens. Chuck Grassley and Joni Ernst, as well as Reps. Cindy Axne, Rod Blum, Abby Finkenauer, Steve King, Dave Loebsack, and David Young. The senators and representatives answered questions and offered valuable insight on taxes, Social Security, the economy, the environment, energy, and internships in Washington, D.C.

Past tours have included visits to the Washington Monument, Lincoln Memorial, Jefferson Memorial, Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial, Arlington National Cemetery, World War II Memorial, Vietnam Veterans Memorial, Korean War Memorial, Iwo Jima Monument, National Archives, Smithsonian Air and Space Museum, U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum, Museum of Art, Museum of American History, Museum of Natural History, Madame Tussaud's Wax Museum, Washington National Cathedral, Mount Vernon, Library of Congress, Supreme Court, Capitol Hill, and the White House.

This contest is open to current juniors whose parents or guardians are members of ECI REC or any of the other 33 IAEC member cooperatives.

## YOUTH LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

The Youth Leadership Council (YLC) is an extension of the Electric Cooperative Youth Tour. Every year, one Youth Tour participant is selected from each participating state to make up the YLC.

YLC representatives are announced each year on the Youth Tour. In July, they return for a week-long summer leadership conference in Washington, D.C., covering topics such as the cooperative business model, grassroots advocacy, community service, and careers in public service. The following year during the NRECA's Annual Meeting, the YLC participates in educational forums and becomes familiar with national issues affecting electric cooperatives and the consumers they serve.
